### Global Education Requirements

#### › World Language

Proficiency at the 12th credit level in a single world language is required of all Smeal students. Review the “Placement Policy for Penn State World Language Courses” prior to planning your world language coursework.

#### › United States Cultures (US) Requirement

Take three credits of intercultural coursework related to diversity in the United States.

#### › International (IL) Requirement

Take three credits of international coursework studying the cultures in other countries.

NOTE: Courses satisfying the culture requirements can count toward General Education and/or Electives based on pre-determined qualifications.

### Preparing to Enroll in a Major

The nine majors offered by Smeal are some of the most popular at Penn State. To enter a major in the college, you must exhibit strong academic performance during your first two years at the University. Entrance to all Smeal majors requires the completion of prescribed entrance to major courses outlined below:

- › ENGL 015 or ENGL 030: Composition\*
- › MGMT 301: Basic Management Concepts\*
- › MATH 110 or MATH 140: Calculus\*
- › MKTG 301: Principles of Marketing\*
- › ECON 102: Microeconomics
- › FIN 301: Corporation Finance\*
- › ACCTG 211: Financial and Managerial Accounting\*
- › SCM 200 or STAT 200: Statistics\*

#### Additional Requirements for the Actuarial Science Major:

- › MATH 140: Calculus with Analytic Geometry I\*
- › MATH 141: Calculus with Analytic Geometry II\*

\* Courses require a grade of “C” or better.



## Selecting a Major

Matriculating from pre-major status to enrollment in a major is contingent upon the timing and completion of cumulative credits at Penn State.

- You must be enrolled as a pre-major in Smeal or as an exploratory student in the Division of Undergraduate Studies (DUS).
- Cumulative credits are credits (courses) taken at Penn State.
- Advanced Placement (AP) credits and credits earned at other institutions are included in Total Credits.
- Complete or currently be enrolled in all entrance to major courses, including obtaining grades of "C" or better in specified courses.
- Once a minimum of 40 cumulative credits—but no more than 59.0 cumulative credits—are earned and entrance to major criteria is met, students apply for their major.
- The typical application period (40-59) is spring semester of the second year.
- Students with 59.1 or more cumulative credits who are still in pre-major status are ineligible to apply for a Smeal major and ineligible to continue their enrollment in the college.

## Grade Point Averages

Attain the minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) established for desired major. Refer to chart below.
